January Meeting: "Andes and Boobies" by David Maddocks

The Galapagos Islands are well known for their wildlife. Lying 1,000km off the coast of Ecuador, the numerous volcanic islands are home to a diversity of plant and animal species, many found nowhere else.

David has visited the Galapagos twice. His last visit was a 2 week trip, most of which was spent on a boat travelling from island to island. This enabled him to travel to the outreaching islands – something which those going for a shorter trip would be unable to do.

No matter how short your trip is, you would undoubtedly come across the Frigate bird. You may not get to see its magnificent throat pouch that it displays during the breeding season, but, like all wildlife in the area, you can approach them without fear of them flying away.



The same goes for the blue-footed Booby. A favourite for many visitors, their brightly coloured feet make them one of the easiest birds to identify. Interestingly, there are 3 species of Booby on



the Galapagos. Each have adapted to their particular habitat. The blue-footed Booby nests on low lying ground. There is a Booby with pink feet that has adapted to enable them to grasp branches. The Nazca Booby, also known as the Masked Booby, nests on much higher ground and has grey feet.

The Galapagos is not all about the birds though. Plants, insects, crabs and iguana all got a mention in David's interesting talk. His special moment was getting close up and personal with a female sea-lion. So close, in fact, he could feel her whiskers on his head! As for those gorgeous eyes **Lesley Brown**

February Meeting: "Charles Rolls of Rolls-Royce" by Bruce Lawson

Charles Rolls was born 27 August 1877 into a wealthy family from Hendre, near Monmouth. His early interest in motor vehicles saw him driving one of the first cars from Cambridge to Monmouth. The car in question was a Peugeot and the journey took 2½ days!

He founded a car dealership, based in London, initially importing cars from France and Belgium. At that time there was no such thing as a British motor industry. Then in 1904 he was introduced to Henry Royce who was starting to design and make British cars, albeit on a very small scale.

In 1906, using Rolls' marketing skills, Royce agreed to sell his cars through him under the name of Rolls-Royce. The company was a huge success, but by 1909 Rolls was losing interest and resigned his position.

He turned his attention to the aviation industry, having had an interest in flying for many years. Initially a balloonist, he soon joined the ranks of the early flyers such as the Wright Brothers. In 1910, Charles Rolls became the first man to make a non-stop crossing from England to France and back again. Tragically, he was to die just one month later when his plane broke up during a flying display, aged just 32. There is now a memorial to Rolls in Monmouth which acknowledges his achievements in the fields of motoring, ballooning and aviation.



Bruce's interesting, and sometimes humorous presentation, gave us a brief picture of a man who lived life to the full. He has written a book entitled "Charles Rolls of Rolls-Royce". Looking for a project, Bruce realised that Rolls was so much more than one half of Rolls-Royce. Bruce is not even that interested in cars!! **Lesley Brown**
